2. General conditions

EIT Manufacturing puts Europe at the center of a global revolution and boosts manufacturing innovation in Europe by connecting people with skills, technologies with markets, and innovators with investors. Technological progress is now exponential, and it is changing the industrial, social and competitive landscape faster than ever before. Our aim is not only to adapt to this revolution, but to lead it. To do so, we need to overcome value network fragmentation and bring stakeholders together. We need to make better use of our knowledge and our strengths to create value and deploy agile mechanisms to accelerate and steer innovation, shaping the future role of manufacturing in our society. With the needs, concerns and ideas of economy and society at its core, the mission of EIT Manufacturing is to empower its partners and stakeholders to fundamentally transform the manufacturing system and meet the global demands of present and future generations.

Primary objectives of the Business Creation team of EIT Manufacturing in 2023-2025 are to support, scale and accelerate innovative ventures and small businesses into impactful powerhouses. In this context, we will foster activities supporting growth of scaleups and startups, taking them beyond the regional and national borders of the European ecosystems. This will be accomplished by Access-to-Market and Access-to-Finance support services, but also through newly created financing envelopes in our Create, Accelerate and Transform programs. In this context, scouting and branding activities of Business Creation operations will be leveraged by continuing the BoostUp! Competitions with a variety of themes in different European locations.

With **“BoostUp! North 2023”** it is intended a call for spin-offs, early-stage startups and mature startups from Sweden, Denmark, Norway, Finland, Iceland, Estonia, Lithuania, Latvia & UK. It is an instrument for EIT Manufacturing to stimulate their ecosystem in order to scout and screen the most innovative solution providers. This is a continuation of BoostUp! activities in 2020, 2021, 2022 and 2023, and will further position the Business Creation pillar of EIT Manufacturing as key innovation support agent in Europe. The geographical focus on Sweden, Denmark, Norway, Finland, Iceland, Estonia, Lithuania, Latvia & UK is adapted to changing ecosystem needs, allowing engagement with the full manufacturing innovation ecosystem in those countries to detect best startups and award them. Business development support and Financial support to third parties is planned, with a total EIT budget of up to €15,000 available for financial prizes for the winners, who are selected by a jury of experts. Proper use of financial support to third parties will be monitored by the Business Creation team.

3. Call specific conditions

3.1 Call thematic and expected results

PURPOSE

EIT Manufacturing organizes the EIT Manufacturing Competition 2023 for North under the brand name “**BoostUp! North 2023**”, a competition for startups in the manufacturing sector with a geographical focus in Sweden, Denmark, Norway, Finland, Iceland, Estonia, Lithuania, Latvia & UK.

TOPIC DESCRIPTION

“**BoostUp! North 2023**” is open to startups with solutions in the realm of manufacturing technologies. In particular, **submissions need to fit one of the following EIT Manufacturing focus areas:**

- **Low Environmental Footprint Systems & Circular Economy for Green Manufacturing**
- **Flexible Production Systems for Competitive Manufacturing**
- **Digital & Collaborative Solutions for Innovative Manufacturing Ecosystems**
- **Human-machine co-working for socially sustainable manufacturing**

Submissions need to fit a least one of the following markets segments:

- Air & Spacecraft
- Appliances
- Automotive
- Electronics
- Industrial Machinery
- Machine Tools
- Marine
- Mobility
- Packaging
- Chemicals & Pharmaceuticals

as well as the following technology domains:

- *Advanced Sensors*
- *Battery / Hydrogen / Energy Storage*
- *CO2 Capture, Utilization & Storage*
- *Connectivity / IoT Infrastructure*
- *AI vision for sustainable solutions*
- *Recycling / Reuse / Remanufacturing*
- *Robotics*

APPLICANTS PROFILE

The applicants have to meet the following conditions:

- The applying startup must be **registered** in one of **Sweden, Denmark, Norway, Finland, Iceland, Estonia, Lithuania, Latvia & UK**;
- Be an entrepreneurial team, with a minimum of two members.
- Startups established and operating for at least one year have to prove **revenue traction** (existing reference customers) or completed proof of concepts of the solution with reference customer;
- The **business development plans** (incl. financial aspects) shall be disclosed;
- The application package should include a **completed application form, pitch deck, logo** and **company registration certificate**.
- The applying startup is **NOT** a Partner Member of EIT Manufacturing, or a Linked Third Party of a Partner Member of EIT Manufacturing.

Startups that have been shortlisted for the 2nd phase of any edition of BoostUp! Competition that took place or will take place before the launch of the “BoostUp! North 2023” call, are NOT eligible.

3.2 Budget and funding

The total maximum EIT funding allocated to this call is 15,000 EUR.

Up to 6 **finalist startups** shortlisted for the 2nd phase will receive exclusive “growth packages” of dedicated Access-to-Market support services provided by the EIT Manufacturing Business Creation team that aims at supporting their internationalization strategy and fostering their innovation. Finalists will also obtain access to EIT

Manufacturing's pan-European innovation network and thus enhance their visibility and international publicity through EIT Manufacturing's communication channels.

The “growth package” of dedicated support services provided by the EIT Manufacturing Business Creation team includes the following:

- Business Development Support
 - Business strategy and roadmap support
 - Business Plan and USP Analysis
 - Commercialisation Plan Analysis (clients, markets)
- Pitch preparation
 - Message refinement, storytelling and structure
 - Rehearsals and Coaching

In addition to the “growth package” award, the **top 3 winning startups** will receive a financial prize to support their European expansion strategy. The prize fund is as follows:

- €5.000 for each winner.

The prize money will be paid to the winning startups after the award ceremony, provided all the requested documents have been submitted (see paragraph 3.3 and 5.5).

Startups shortlisted for the 2nd phase shall participate to the in-person final event and pitch their proposal to an expert jury panel to be entitled to receive the award.

3.3 Monitoring and Control related to the “BoostUp! 2023 North edition” Financial Prize

CONTROL / COMPLIANCE BEFORE PAYING OUT THE FINANCIAL PRIZE

Before EIT Manufacturing awards the prize money, the winning startups must provide both their banking and fiscal documentation. Additionally, they must disclose if there are any pending issues with government authorities or agencies in accordance with EU funding rules and Horizon Europe legislation.

All shortlisted applicants participating to the 2nd phase must sign and submit during the application process a “Declaration of Honour” (see also point 6.8), which is annexed to

these guidelines. If an issue is identified, EIT Manufacturing reserves the right to withdraw the award of the **BoostUp! North 2023** prize.

3.4 Reporting

Prize winners must report one (1) month after final receipt of support from EIT Manufacturing. This reporting must confirm that they received the “growth package” prize.

4. Proposal preparation and submission

All applications and supporting documents and material must be submitted in English using the application forms linked on the [competition website](#) – no paper submissions will be considered.

Applicants' representatives must register and validate the account if this is the first time accessing the platform. If applicants' representative has already created an account, the representative can proceed to log in. Once logged in, start a new application. During the application all compulsory fields must be filled.

The official language of the competition is English (i.e., all submission material must be submitted in English and the representative of finalist startups selected to participate in the final event must pitch in English language).

The following documentation must be submitted by the applicants through the submission tool **no later than the call deadline January 1st , 2024, 23:59 CET.**

- Application form
- Company Pitch Deck in Microsoft PowerPoint format; such file will be used as supporting presentation in case the startup is shortlisted for the 2nd phase: the document must be tailored to a 5 minute presentation and the following details shall be clearly outlined (not in order):
 - industry pain points, the innovativeness, scalability and impact of the solution(s)
 - target markets and description of the main(s) applicative use case(s) addressed by the company offerings and technologies
 - competitive outlook of the solutions
 - team and company organization
 - existing business traction (i.e., revenues from commercial activities, on going proof of concepts, investment raised/funding situation)
 - business development plans (incl. financial aspects) and go-to-European-market strategy
- Company logo in high quality graphic format (this will be used for the call promotional campaign)
- Company Registration Certificate

NOTE: Only applications submitted through the online link (as noted above) before the deadline will be accepted and considered. The organizers reserve the right to extend the

submission deadline; any extension of the deadline will be communicated to the public on the competition website.

Any documentation missing or considered incomplete, may be a reason for application rejection.

5. Proposal evaluation and selection process

5.1 Eligibility and admissibility check

A submission will be considered admissible if:

Completeness	The submitted proposal is completed, submitted in time via the submission tool, in English with all its mandatory sections and compulsory documents included (application form, pitch presentation, company logo, company registration certificate).

Admissible submissions will be considered eligible if:

Applicant profile	The applicant's profile is in line with the requirements presented under point 3.1 "Applicants profile"

Applications containing one or more inadmissible or ineligible elements will receive an official communication from EIT Manufacturing setting out the outcome of the eligibility and admissibility check and explaining why the proposal failed to meet the criteria.

The applicant deemed ineligible and wishing to dispute the ineligibility decision, may appeal. This appeal must be made within 5 working days from the official EIT Manufacturing notification of ineligibility (see paragraph 5.4 and the document Appeal procedure linked to the call and available from the Competition website).

5.2 Evaluation of proposals

The evaluation of all eligible applications will be conducted in two steps:

5.2.1 1st phase – evaluation of proposals

Applicants' submissions will first be reviewed online by a panel composed by 3 evaluators with same weighting of scores:

- one member from EIT Manufacturing (1/3)
- two external independent evaluators (2/3)

Each evaluator will have to score each application based on four standardised criteria: Excellence, Impact, Market fit, Strategic fit.

External evaluators will assess each evaluation criterion according to the following scores on a scale **from 1 to 5**:

Score	Description	
1	<i>Extremely poor or None</i>	The information provided is considered irrelevant or inadequate compared to the specific call provisions
2	<i>Bad</i>	The information provided lacks relevant quality and contains significant weaknesses, compared to the specific call provisions
3	<i>Average</i>	The overall information provided is adequate, however, some aspects are unclearly or insufficiently detailed, compared to the specific call provisions
4	<i>Good</i>	The information provided is adequate with sufficiently outlined details, compared to the specific call provisions
5	<i>Excellent</i>	The information provided is outstanding in its details, clarity and coherence, compared to the specific call provisions

The scores given at criterion level are then summed together to come to the final score.

Thresholds apply to individual criteria and to the total score. The maximum score for a proposal is 20. The default threshold for individual criteria is 3/5 and the default overall threshold is 12/20.

The evaluators will assess each startup application. The Submission Management System [SUBMITTABLE](#) will create an average score per application based on the individual evaluators' scorings and produce an Individual Evaluation Report (IER) per application (each application is evaluated 3 times). The evaluators will meet in a consensus meeting chaired by an independent rapporteur to discuss and build an agreement. The rapporteur will address any notable divergences between their evaluations and will develop the final Evaluation Summary Reports of the 1st phase – evaluation of proposals.

The top 6 ranked applications (the finalists) will be shortlisted for the 2nd phase – in-person pitching event.

5.2.2 2nd phase – In- person pitching event

The finalist startups will be invited to attend in-person the “BoostUp! North 2023” final event. Shortlisted finalists will be evaluated by a jury panel composed by three (3) evaluators with the same weighting of scores. The jury panel will refer to the same evaluation criteria and scoring system of the 1st phase (section 5.2.1).

The format of the live pitch will be 6 minutes per presentation (3 minutes presentation by the applicants and 3 minutes questions from the jury panel). The final scoring of the successful applicants will be agreed by the jury members in a consensus meeting, which will be held right after the end of the pitching session and will be chaired by an independent rapporteur. The rapporteur will address any notable divergences between them and will develop the final Evaluation Summary Report of phase 2.

The “BoostUp! North 2023” live pitch will happen during the “BoostUp! North 2023” event, on February 8th in Gothenburg, Sweden. The agenda for this in-person event will be announced on the Competition website. It is the participants’ responsibility to keep track of announcements and information on the EIT Manufacturing BoostUp! Competition webpage. All shortlisted finalists will also receive an email with the detailed timing of the final pitching competition sessions prior to the event.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Shortlisted finalists which, for whatever reason, fail to attend the in-person final event at the given time and venue will be disqualified and will not be entitled to any award.

5.3 Communication of results

1st phase – (online evaluation and selection of finalists): results will be communicated to the email of the applicant representative registered at the submission platform (Note: Please, check your spam folder). Results will be communicated with a rejection letter or email to non-qualified applicants or an invitation letter or email to phase 2 of the evaluation process. Results will include the evaluations.

2nd phase – in-person pitching event: a jury deliberation meeting will take place during the final event immediately after the pitch session (section 5.2.2). Right after the jury decision is taken, the results will be announced publicly at the award ceremony. Individual scores and comments made by evaluators will remain confidential.

5.4 Procedure for complaints and appeal

The applicant (the representative of the legal entity) of a rejected application who disagrees with the decision may request an evaluation review. **Only procedural aspects of an evaluation may be the subject of a request for an evaluation review**, for example process errors or technical problems. The evaluation of the merits of a proposal shall not be the subject of an evaluation review. In this case, the applicant will have 5 working days

after receipt of the final evaluation results to submit an appeal to the Evaluation (see document Appeal procedure)

5.5 Selected applicants and follow-up

The shortlisted applicants will receive the following awards:

- All up to **6 shortlisted startups (the Finalists)** which attend the event and pitch in front of the jury panel will be offered “growth packages” of dedicated support services for two (2) months provided by the EIT Manufacturing Business Creation team and based on the company’s individual needs. A dedicated Service Agreement will be signed between each startup and EIT Manufacturing.
- All **6 shortlisted applicants (the Finalists)** will enjoy visibility and international publicity through EIT Manufacturing’s communication channels.
- The **3 winning applicants (the Winners)**, as nominated by the jury panel during the final event, will be offered a “growth package” of dedicated business development support for up to 4 months provided by the EIT Manufacturing Business Creation team. A dedicated Service Agreement will be signed between each startup and EIT Manufacturing. Also, the winning startups will receive a financial prize of €5.000 each to support their European expansion strategy.

Applicants shortlisted to the 2nd phase will have to diligently collaborate to in the following steps that will be taken after closing the competition:

- Providing EIT Manufacturing with required banking and fiscal details (applicable to the Winners only).
- Signature of a Declaration of Honour (see point 6.8) which can be downloaded from the Competition website (applicable to Finalists and Winners).
- Signature of the Service Agreement and/ or the Financial Prize agreement (the latter applicable to the Winners only).
- Collaborate with the Business Creation team of EIT Manufacturing during the delivery of “growth package” support services.
- Within one month from the end of the Service Agreement or by no later than **January 10th, 2025**, whichever date comes first: signature of a Support Review Form (SRF) confirming:

- i. the length and type of services provided by the Business Creation team of EIT Manufacturing and how such services contributed to the startup growth;
- ii. the amount, type and source of financing received by the startup during the support period.

The template of such Support Review Document will be provided in due time by the Business Creation team and shall be signed by a legal representative of the startup.

6. Other terms and Conditions

6.1 Communication, Dissemination, Visibility of funding

Prize winners must promote the prize and its results, by providing targeted information to multiple audiences (including the media and the public) in a strategic and effective manner. Communication activities related to the prize (including media interviews, press statements, presentations, etc., in electronic form, via traditional or social media, etc.), must acknowledge EU support and display the EIT Manufacturing logo (emblem) and text. The emblem must remain distinct and separate and cannot be modified by adding other visual marks, brands or text. Apart from the emblem, no other visual identity or logo may be used to highlight the EIT Manufacturing support. When displayed in association with other logos (e.g., of winners or sponsors), the emblem must be displayed at least as prominently and visibly as the other logos.

For the purposes of these obligations, the winners may use the emblem without first obtaining approval from EIT Manufacturing. This does not, however, give them the right to exclusive use. Moreover, they may not appropriate the emblem or any similar trademark or logo, either by registration or by any other means. Any communication or dissemination activity related to the prize must use factually accurate information.

The EIT Manufacturing may use, for their communication and publicising activities, information relating to the prize, as well as photos or audio-visual material that they receive from the applicants (including in electronic form), and photos and videos taken either in preparation of the award ceremony or during the award ceremony. The EIT Manufacturing will publish the name of both the finalist/s and the selected applicants their origin, the amount of the prize and its nature and purpose.

6.2 Intellectual Property Rights

Participants retain full and exclusive ownership of their prior information and intellectual property rights. By submitting their application, participants affirm that they hold ownership or have legally secured the right to use all elements of the innovative product or service. Participants agree to indemnify and hold harmless EIT Manufacturing and/or any assignee or affiliate from any third-party allegations or claims of intellectual property rights infringement by the product or service of participants.

Participants shall have the right to further develop, use and license their intellectual property rights for creating, making, marketing and distributing products, services and technology.

Participants agree to respect IPR Rules (Article 16) of the Model Grant Agreement.

Participants also agree to respect the [EIT Manufacturing IP Policy](#).

6.3 Right to activate audits

EIT Manufacturing retains the right to activate an audit on “BoostUp! North 2023” prize winners, in case of alerts and/or to confirm governance and proper usage of the financial prize.

EIT Manufacturing keeps the right to request any data related to the “BoostUp! North 2023” Competition during 5 years after completion to ensure transparency and allow monitoring from EIT.

6.4 Withdrawal of the prize — Recovery of undue amounts

EIT Manufacturing may withdraw the prize after its award and recover all payments made, if it finds out that:

- false information, fraud or corruption was used to obtain it
- the prize winners were not eligible or should have been excluded or – the prize winners are in serious breach of their obligations under the Guidelines

6.5 Data protection

EIT Manufacturing ensures that any processing of personal data shall be performed in accordance with Regulation (EU) 2016/679 of the European Parliament and of the Council of 27 April 2016, on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data and on the free movement of such data, and in accordance with Directive 95/46/EC (General Data Protection Regulation). As a data subject you have the right of access, the right to rectification, the right to erasure, the right to restrict processing, the right to data portability, the right to object and the right not to be subject to a decision based solely on automated processing. If you have a question about personal data processing or want to exercise your data subject rights, you can contact our Data

Protection Officer on dpo@eitmanufacturing.eu. In the case of complaints, you can address them to the French regulator CNIL.

The collected personal data will be used solely for the procedure and assessment of the applications and the management, completion, organization, dissemination of information and publicity of the Competition. The data controller is EIT Manufacturing and/or its subsidiaries.

Personal data shall be deleted 5 years after the announcement of the competition winners.

Participants have the possibility to indicate that EIT Manufacturing may grant access to parts of their submission to trusted investors and partners.

The application submission and evaluation process will be done via Submittable (<http://www.submittable.com>), an online submission management tool by “Submittable Holdings, Inc”.

6.6 Acceptance of the Guidelines

By submitting the application form, the participant agrees to these Guidelines and its Annexes, which form part of the submission. Participants agree that they have no legal entitlement to a prize.

EIT Manufacturing reserves the right to make reasonable amendments to these Guidelines. Amendments and additions to these Guidelines shall be valid only if communicated in writing or otherwise made available to the participants on the [call page of the EIT Manufacturing website](#).

EIT Manufacturing also reserves the right to cancel or declare the Competition unsuccessful provided all applicants are informed and sufficient justification is given (for example no applications received, or all applications do not pass the default thresholds).

6.7 Confidentiality

EIT Manufacturing undertakes to use any Confidential Information shared by the applicants solely for the purposes of the BoostUp! competition. Confidential information shall mean data and/or information that is proprietary to, or possessed by, the applicants and not generally known to the public, or that has not yet been revealed whether in tangible or intangible form, whenever and however disclosed and might also be included in the application form. Confidential information must be expressly labelled as such in the application form.

Applicants agree that EIT Manufacturing and its subsidiaries can disseminate, publish, and make use of non-confidential information regarding the call, to promote the activities of EIT Manufacturing or establish reports or other necessary documents for EIT.

The applicants agree that data and information in the application form not labelled as confidential may be disclosed in connection with the activities of EIT Manufacturing.

Considering the confidential nature of the data and information referred to above, EIT Manufacturing also undertakes to (i) not disclose them in any way and in any form, without prior written authorization of the company concerned; and (ii) not to use them for purposes other than those strictly necessary for participation in the BoostUp! Competition.

Confidential Information may be shared among EIT Manufacturing and its subsidiaries (e.g. CLCs) solely for the purposes of the BoostUp! Competition Activity. EIT Manufacturing undertakes to impose this confidentiality obligation on its employees and the employees of its subsidiaries and its collaborators, as well as on Rapporteurs and independent experts and all subjects who, by virtue of participating in the call for proposal as members of the Selection Committees or Jury, will take knowledge of or may have access to such confidential data and information.

6.8 Exclusion Criteria

Applicants will be excluded from participating in the call if they are in any of the situations of exclusion defined in [Article 136 of the EU Financial Regulation](#). All shortlisted applicants participating to the 2nd phase shall sign a Declaration of Honour to confirm that they respect the above-mentioned criteria at the application stage. All shortlisted applicants participating to the 2nd phase may be requested to provide relevant recent documentation substantiating the Declaration of Honour. Failure to provide adequate documentation may result in the exclusion of the applicants concerned.

6.9 Applicable Law

The present guidelines are governed by the applicable European Union laws (i.e. the EIT Regulation, the EU Financial Regulation and the Horizon Europe Regulation) and is complemented, where necessary, by the law of France. The applicants agree to observe the obligations set forth in the [\(Model\) Grant Agreement](#) signed between the EIT and EIT Manufacturing and particularly Articles 12 (conflict of interest), 13 (confidentiality and security), 14 (ethics), 17.2 (visibility), 18 (specific rules for carrying out action), 19 (information) and 20 (record-keeping). These obligations will also be mentioned in contracts to be signed if the application is successful.
